Well, it's been a difficult end to the term with the many absences and levels of sickness. It's been great in this last week of term to see that most children are now back in school. Thank you to the overwhelming number of parents who have supported us and once again, understood the challenges for all of us as a Community.

Much has been achieved this term. The children have completed some really interesting and inspiring learning enquiries in Geography, Science, DT and Art. I've thoroughly enjoyed being an audience at music lessons this term too. We have some superb musicians and I've also been impressed with so many children greeting me in

Spanish! So, following lockdown periods, we've returned this year ensuring that our children get an excellent offer in terms of all curriculum subjects.

Character education is also an important part of our curriculum at Galmpton and I've been so impressed at how proactive and independent our children have been in terms of creating change and giving to others who need our support. We gave a record 111 shoe boxes to Operation Christmas Child. Even after this very generous offering, many children (without any prompting from school) found ways to continue raising money for the Royal British Legion, Totnes Refugee Charity, Children in Need and the Rowcroft Reindeer Run. Galmpton Nominated for National Award

We were absolutely thrilled to have our work around attachment and trauma recognised at a national level. Galmpton was one of three schools to be shortlisted for the Timpson Award, awarded by the Attachment Research Centre (ARC). Although we didn't win, we were happy to have been recognised for the support we give to our most vulnerable children. The nomination and attendance at this year's conference has redoubled our efforts to ensure that Galmpton Primary leads the way as a nationally recognised inclusive school. We thank her for her significant contribution at Galmpton and know that her private work as a Counsellor will thrive as a result of her expertise and considerable knowledge. Mrs Fisher's time as Inclusion Lead will be increased in the new year. In the next newsletter we will ensure you know how the pastoral work led by Mrs Crutchlow will continue and how we will continue to prioritise the well-being of all children.

Mrs Paskin returns from maternity leave in January and we're looking forward to having her back in Year 1 class. Fortunately for Year 1, Mrs Maker will continue to offer teaching support and will also take on a wider role of covering planning time for some teachers too.

Mrs Housden's contract also comes to an end at Christmas. Mrs Housden started at Galmpton as a 'catch up tutor' but stayed on with us whilst Mrs Paskin was on leave. 

Dear Class 4 and teachers.

A huge thank you to all of you, who made, brought in, sold and ate cakes! Your donation to Beyond Borders is amazing.

People from other countries who have been persecuted and whose lives are in danger often have no choice but to make the desperate decision to leave everything behind, including their friends and family, and flee to safety. They don't want to do this; the alternatives are often persecution, imprisonment, or death. Some come to the UK where they apply for asylum. They are then sent to various cities across the country and in our area, some are sent to Plymouth, and some to Exeter. Often those who have fled their homes have been forced to leave their children or siblings behind or have had to make the terrible decision to leave them, because the journey itself posed too many dangers.

In Plymouth, the Red Cross runs a family reunification service, which helps people who have acquired refugee status to find their family members and apply for them to join them here. Beyond Borders has raised funds to support this service, and has helped families come together in Plymouth. This is where the money you have raised will go. It will help people like Lyla (which is not her real name) who fled persecution in her own country and who was forced to leave her four children behind in the care of a relative. Lyla found out through a cousin who risked her life to communicate with Lyla, that the relative was not treating her children well, and eventually, she was able to communicate with them on What's App, secretly, and find out what was happening to them. They wanted desperately to be with their mother in Plymouth. As soon as she got refugee status, Lyla went to the Red Cross for help. The four children needed a lot of medical tests before they could come here, not just for Covid, but also for TB. They and their mother also needed DNA tests to prove that they were from the same family. Four visas, and flights were needed and travel to the airport and the clinics where the medical tests were to take place and also overnight stays. An Interpreter was needed to ensure that all paperwork was understood and in order. The whole process was very expensive indeed, but typical of the costs involved for all families who are trying to get back together. There are always more people wanting to reunite with their families than there is money to pay for that to happen. So your fundraising is like gold dust.

Can you imagine how happy and relieved people like Lyla and her four children will be when they eventually get to this country safely, not in an inflatable boat on a dangerous sea, but in a plane. They will be met by members of the Red Cross and they will travel down to Plymouth to be with their mother after several years of being apart. The four children will not have to suffer the ill treatment at the hands of the relative any longer and will be safe.

This is just one of the family reunification stories, but there are many like this.

Your donation will give great joy and hope to people like Lyla and her four children. The money you have raised will help families to get back together. It will take children away from dangerous and frightening situations, and will provide safe passage for family members to this country.
